

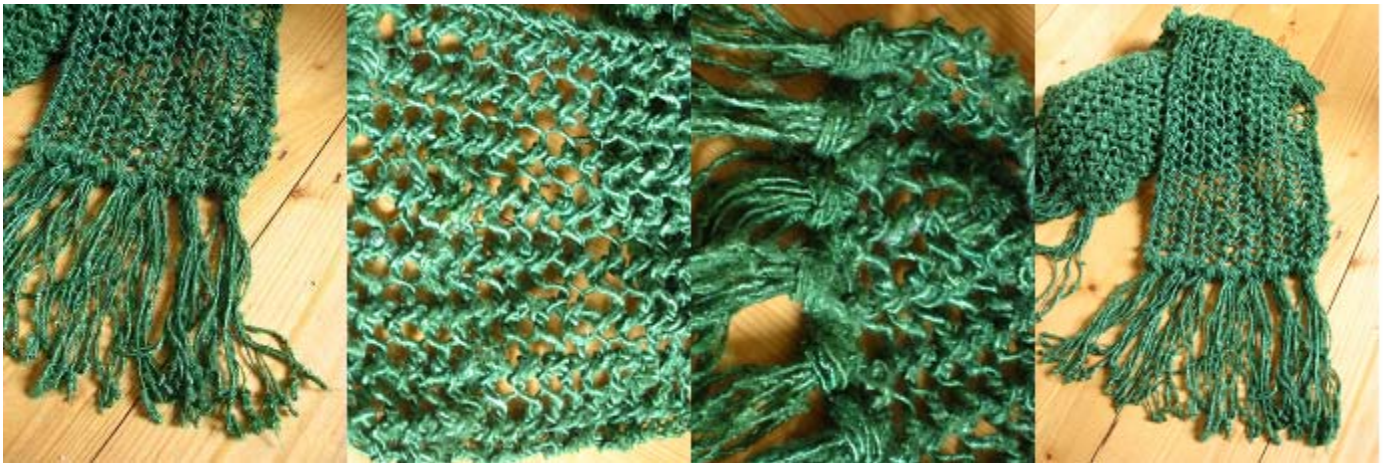


Wanda's Wonders

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Juicy Banana Silk Scarf

made from rows and rows of holes



This is a long, dangly piece of delicious bulky silky luxury to warm your neck

Yarn: Approx 400 g Banana Silk (2 hanks) in the colour of your choice or any bulky yarn from your stash
Needle size: 6 mm

Abbreviations: yo = yarn over; skp = slip 1, knit 1, pass slipped stitch over; sts = stitches;
beg = beginning; K = knit

Pattern: Cast on 18 sts on needle size 6 mm, K 1 row, on 2nd row *K1 sts, yo, skp, repeat this stitch until 1 sts remain on row. K the last stitch*. Repeat from * - * on all rows until you knit approx 250 cm. Now K 1 row and cast off on next row.

Assembly: Weave in ends. Now make fringe - you will need 7 tassels for each end of the scarf. To make one tassel: Take 5 pieces of yarn approx 42 cm long and fold them in half together. Pass the loop end through the scarf in the first row of pattern knitting, then pass the cut yarn ends through the loop, and tighten the tassel. Ensure to distribute the fringe evenly on both ends of the scarf. To avoid the yarn ends unraveling you can tie a small knot on each yarn end of the fringe.

You have now captured the juicy phenomenon of Banana Silk Scarf, all that remain is to tie it around your neck and enjoy!
